



Prioritize Gaps to Address



Gap Identification Process

Gap: A practice that is not effectively being implemented across and/or within Virginia state agencies which in turn limits the Commonwealth's ability to successfully execute flood resilience strategies statewide.

Priority Gaps to be Addressed

Funding and Resource Gaps

- Limited resources for asset maintenance
- Insufficient funding for long-term resilience planning to meet state and local government needs
- Overreliance on temporary federal funding

Data and Decision-Making Gaps

- Access to up-to-date, comprehensive data to support long-term flood resilience planning and resource allocation
- Robust decision-making frameworks to guide long-term planning and resource allocation
- Interdepartmental data sharing and coordination for comprehensive flood risk assessments

Staff Capacity Gaps

- Coordination between federal, state, and local agencies during events to ensure targeted response
- Support for state and federal grant applications, compliance, and management at the local level
- Technical assistance for funding and program initiatives tied to long-term flood resilience
- Integration and application of flood resilience tools


Community Capacity and Engagement Gaps

- Community knowledge and capacity to take proactive steps to reduce flood vulnerability
- Coordination among state agencies to streamline flood resilience strategies and minimize redundancies

What is the Flood Story Web App?


- Platform where Virginians can share their personal flood experiences


