PHASE 3: PRIORITIZE GAPS TO ADDRESS

Purpose:

Identify and prioritize data, resource, and capacity gaps in statewide flood risk management.

During the Prioritize Gaps to Address phase, the Plan Development Team:

Analyzed state agency plans, resources, programs, and policies to identify gaps in flood resilience practices that would prevent flood resilience objectives from being completed

Conducted interviews, in-person workshops, and virtual feedback sessions with community and sate agency stakeholders to prioritize identified gaps

Synthesized background research and stakeholder input to develop a list of prioritized gaps to be addressed by the VFPMP
