

State Park Master Planning Code

§ 10.1-200.1. State park master planning

- (i) for all existing state parks, (ii) substantial land acquisitions, and (iii) prior to major improvements
- A guide for the development, utilization and management of a Parks <u>natural</u>, <u>cultural</u>, <u>and</u>
 historic resources
- Developed in stages with public input at each step



Planning Purpose

- Update the Lake Anna State Park Master Plan based on changes to existing conditions and trends in outdoor recreation relative to the park's context within the local community, region, and Virginia State Parks system
- Update the phased development plan based on current and projected needs over the next 30 years
- Set a framework of goals, programming, and priority implementation for the development of the park and future acquisitions







Which activities are most needed?

- Informs the Virginia Outdoors Plan
- Informs Planning for Outdoor Recreation Facilities Generally
- Most Popular Activities (> 20%): Participation versus Most Needed
 - Participation > Need: Walking for pleasure, viewing the water, viewing scenery
 - Need = Participation: Visiting a park, visiting natural/historical areas, hiking, sunbathing, bird watching, fishing
 - Need > Participation: Outdoor festivals, nature-based tours, nature study/programs
 canoeing/kayaking, tubing on the water, horseback riding, swimming, picnicking, bike trails,

Master Plan Goals



Master Plan Goals

- **Goal 1.0. Resource Protection** Protect the natural, historic, cultural, and scenic resources encompassed within the park boundaries by preserving the lakeshore, its tributaries, and rich upland forest and meadows flanking its shores.
- **Goal 2.0. Recreational Facilities** Provide a haven for day-use and overnight recreational activities by affording access to the land and water while protecting resources from damage associated with overuse.
- **Goal 3.0. Public Engagement** Administer the park in professional manner that enhances public participation, transparency, and accountability to foster trust and give visitors and the Lake Anna community a stake in decisions concerning the park.
- Goal 4.0. Community Partnerships Collaborate with community partners to market the state park as a regional destination, address issues and concerns associated with park usage, and provide local volunteer opportunities.

Master Plan Goals

Goal 5.0. Educational and Interpretive Programs – Increase public awareness of the park by providing meaningful opportunities to learn about its unique history and by highlighting the importance of environmental stewardship through development of hands-on educational opportunities and immersive interpretive exhibits.

Goal 6.0: Visitor Satisfaction – Optimize operations and visitor services to ensure a welcoming environment by providing ample spaces for the safe enjoyment of the lakeshore and its environs while protecting against the effects of overcrowding.

Goal 7.0. Staffing, Funding, and Equipment – Provide sufficient staffing and facilities to fulfill the purpose of the Lake Anna Master Plan and meet visitors' needs while striving for positive economic impacts to the Commonwealth and community, respectively.

- Phase 2: Focuses on expansion of overnight facilities as well as additional amenities at the beach area



- Spring 2025: Presentation to the Board of Conservation and Recreation (BCR) and additional opportunity for public input
- Following public comment and approval from BCR, Master Plan will be made available to the General Assembly for a 30day review
- Spring/Summer 2025: Final adoption by the DCR Director
- Expected buildout is 30 years
