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NRCS & SWCD Relationship on Watershed Dams

 Federally assisted dams that are locally owned (Sponsoring Local Organization) O&M Responsibilities O&M Agreement Project is locally owned Cost share Landrights (easements, etc) Permits **■**0&M

O&M Responsibilities

- NRCS responsible to protect federal interest, public safety
- Sponsor Responsible to safely operate and maintain structure (in accordance with the O&M Agreement and Plan) to serve the planned purpose for the program life of the project
 - Sponsor may contract with others to perform O&M but this does not relieve them of legal obligation for O&M

O&M Agreement

- Legal document between NRCS and Sponsor
 O&M Agreement details who is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the dam
 Agreement details responsibilities of NRCS and SLO(s)
- In general

 NRCS will provide technical assistance if resources are available, no commitment of financial assistance

SLO(s) will operate and maintain the structure

Remember – Federally assisted project, Locally Owned

Operation

The administration, management, and performance of non-maintenance activities necessary to keep a practice safe and functioning as planned. Performance of services to keep structures in such a condition that the safety, welfare, enjoyment and health of project users are not compromised.

Maintenance

The recurring activities necessary to retain or restore a practice in a safe and functioning condition, including the management of vegetation, the repair or replacement of failed components, the prevention or treatment of deterioration, and the repair of damages caused by flooding or vandalism.

Work and actions required to keep project measures in a condition to function for their intended purposes.

Inspections

Why? Observe structure conditions Determine the maintenance required FY 09 Special Inspections "Baseline" assessment Monitor compliance with O&M agreement "Green" Info Sheet

FY09 Special Inspections Description of deficiency Roads in ASW downstream of control section Seeps Corrective actions Dates for completion Failure to perform the required action within the specified time may be a violation of the O&M agreement. "Next level" – will discuss later

FY09 Special Inspections Contact the DC request technical assistance. Contact SCE with questions regarding the content of the report or required action. Does not take the place of State mandated inspections. State dam safety regulations may require you to take additional actions in order to satisfy state regulatory requirements.

Virginia NRCS Amendment to National O&M Policy – Inspections

 Coordination of NRCS policy with Virginia State Dam safety requirements.
 NRCS assistance will not compete with state dam safety inspection requirements
 Owner's Responsibility to comply

Virginia NRCS Amendment to National O&M Policy – Inspections

 DC role in onsite inspections of watershed structures.

- DC encouraged to participate in annual inspections
- DC required to participate in annual inspections at least once every 3 years
- DC to review O&M Agreement with Sponsor every 5 years
- Clarification of documentation requirements. (see "Blue" handout)

Emergency Action Plan

 Policy – National Operation & Maintenance Manual, National Engineering Manual
 Required by NRCS on High Hazard dams
 Identifies appropriate responses to minimize risk to life and property with the integrity of the dam may be in jeopardy
 Sample EAP

EAP Responsibilities

NRCS

- review EAP for all new or rehabbed dams
- Assistance for preparation and review if resources are available

Sponsor

- Prepare and implement EAP
- Coordinate with emergency official and state dam safety during preparation and implementation
- Review and revise EAP annually
- Exercise EAP at least once every 5 years
- Training of all persons involved in EAP
- Report Emergency Situation

Does not take the place of State Dam Safety requirements
