Ranger Recommendations

- All caches are near a trail or road.
 Stay close to the trail to avoid disturbing wildlife or vegetation.
- Geocaches are often in, under or around distinctive features or landmarks, such as rockpiles, large trees or fallen logs.
- Geocaches will never be too high for you to reach or buried underground.
- Be sure to watch out for snakes, wasps and other critters while searching.
- Don't forget to sign your name and date in the notepads included in the caches.
- If you take an item, please leave one of equal or lesser value.
- GPS units only point in the correct direction if you are moving! Once you are within 20 ft of your destination, put down the unit and look around!



Popular since its invention in the year 2000, Geocaching continues to grow today as a fascinating pastime. You can use the Global Positioning System (GPS) to find hidden boxes of treasure (caches) in some of the most beautiful natural areas of the park.

Each stop along this guided GPS tour contains a hidden geocache. Find the caches to swap gadgets or trinkets with other treasure-hunters and discover the cultural and natural history of James River State Park.

The geocaching tour is 4.5 miles and consists of 7 stops. You can follow the suggested tour route in order and complete all 7 at once, or pick and choose which caches you want to explore.
